1.0 GENERAL INTRODUCTION

The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (FoHSS) is one of the three faculties at Dar es Salaam University College of Education (DUCE) others are Faculty of Education and Faculty of Science. The faculty primarily hosts and offers three postgraduate degree programs which are Master of Arts with Education (M.A.Ed.), Master of Arts in Development Evaluation (MADE and Master of Arts in Public Administration (MAPA). Among the three programs, two which are MAED and MADE are offered in regular time while MAPA is offered in the evening. Studies in the three programs are semesterized and students enrolled in any of the programs are supposed to register and study all compulsory courses offered in all semesters according to the programme enrolled.

2.0 MASTER OF ARTS WITH EDUCATION DEGREE (MAED)

This programme is designed for arts, humanities and social sciences educators who want to further develop their subjects' mastery and pedagogical, scholarly, research and leadership abilities through in-depth study in theory and practice.

- **2.1 Purpose:** By the end of the M.A. (Ed.) Programme, students are expected to be able to:
 - i. Teach arts, humanities and social sciences in secondary schools, colleges, universities and short courses;
 - ii. Apply education principles, approaches and theories in improving teaching and learning processes;
 - iii. Assess and analyze various theories, principles and concepts related to education, social sciences and arts;
 - iv. Identify and analyze challenges that constraint education sector in Tanzania and beyond;
 - v. Identify opportunities to strengthen education sector and enhance performance of students in schools and colleges;
 - vi. Do research on education, social sciences and arts which will contribute to new theoretical insights and practical approaches to education and promote scholarly publications; and

vii. Plan, manage and analyze educational policies, programmes and projects.

- **2.2 Mode of delivery**: This Full Time programme engages Mixed Modes of Delivery (i.e. lectures, practical's, and seminars).
- **2.3 Assessment strategy**: Evaluation of the programmes will be through coursework and examinations. Except for the research report, each course will be evaluated as follows: Coursework: exercises, tests, and term paper/presentations 50% and Final Examination: 50%. The pass mark for each examinable course shall be 50%.
- **2.4 Duration**: This is a 24 Months programme with minimum credit for graduation being 180 credits

3.0 PROGRAMME STRUCTURE AND COURSES

All students pursuing MA (Ed.) take one major arts subject offered from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences and pedagogy courses offered from the Faculty of Education. In the last semester of the study student will conductor research and write a report. However, students are free to choose and write on any area of their interest, i.e. on arts or in pedagogy area.

The programme comprises five streams, namely; linguistics stream, geography stream, Kiswahili linguistics stream, Kiswahili literature stream and history stream. The course structure and credits to be studied from different departments are identified in the table below: -

4.0 MASTER OF ARTS IN DEVELOPMENT EVALUATION PROGRAMME (MADE)

The main objective of the Master of Arts in Development Evaluation Programme is to build capacity of future development evaluation scholars and professionals who will have:-

- i. Strong foundations in theoretical and methodological approaches to Development Evaluation.
- ii. Good understanding of development evaluation tasks, standards, principles and the professional codes of ethics of development evaluators.
- iii. Enormous expertise in various approaches and methods for conducting quality and credible development evaluations.
- **4.1** This programme is hosted in the department of History, Political Science, and Development Studies in the Faculty of humanities and social sciences at the Dar es Salaam University College of Education.
- **4.2 Duration of the programme:** The programme lasts for eighteen months (18 months) with two semesters dedicated for coursework component and the third semester for research and writing of dissertation. The Coursework component comprises minimum of 120 credits from both core and elective courses while dissertation component consists of 60 credits.
- **4.3 Programme Status**: Full Time (**Regular**)

4.4 Mode of Delivery: The programme is delivered through a combination of lectures, seminars, self-study and assessments. In addition, students will do research and finally write a master's dissertation.

5.0 MASTER OF ARTS IN PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION (MAPA)

The Master of Arts in Public Administration (MPA) is designed for Political Scientists, Public Administration, Policy Analysts, Policy Makers, Human Resource Practitioners, Public Service Managers and those working in the private sector with professional orientations relevant to MPA who want to enhance their practical and theoretical competencies to a graduate level. **Purpose:** By the end of the MPA Programme, students are expected to be able to:

i. Apply administrative theories, principles, and approaches to improving real-life situations;

- ii. Assess and analyze various concepts, theories, principles, and approaches as related to the management of public affairs;
- iii. Compare various institutional practices and their implications on the performance of administrative systems;
- iv. Conduct independent research, analyze and interpret findings;
- v. Analyze and evaluate public policies; and
- vi. Plan and manage human and other resources.

Mode of delivery: This is an Evening program that engages Mixed Modes of Delivery (i.e. lectures, and seminar discussions).

Assessment strategy: Evaluation of the programme will be through coursework and examinations. Except for the dissertation, each course will be evaluated as follows: Coursework: exercises, tests, seminars and term paper/presentations 50% and Final Examination: 50%. The pass mark for each examinable course shall be 50%.

Duration: This is a 24 months programme with minimum credit for graduation being 180 credits out of which 120 credits (i.e. 10 courses) will be for coursework and 60 credits for a Dissertation.

6.0 CONDITION FOR CONTINUATION AND DISCONTINUATION

These conditions apply to all the three postgraduate programs hosted in the Faculty

- i. Candidates must successfully complete the coursework phase before they are allowed to proceed to the dissertation phase. Successful completion of the coursework phase shall mean attainment of a "B" grade or above (i.e. a grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.0 in all examinations.
- ii. Candidates who fail in one or more examinations, but whose GPA is 2.7 and above, shall be allowed to do supplementary examination(s) in the failed course(s).
- iii. Candidates who fail to attain a GPA of 2.7 shall be discontinued from studies.
- iv. Candidates who fail in any supplementary examination and have a GPA of 3.0 and above may be allowed to repeat the failed course(s) but shall not be allowed to proceed to the dissertation phase before passing the failed course(s).
- v. Candidates who fail to attain a GPA of at least 3.0 after supplementary examinations shall be discontinued from studies.
