I. Academic Residency

The next open application period for academics begins **March 1, 2016** with the deadline of **May 2, 2016** for possible residencies in 2017.

The Academic Writing residency is for university and thinktank-based academics, researchers, professors, and scientists working in any discipline. Successful applicants will demonstrate decades of significant professional contributions to their field or show evidence of being on a strong upward trajectory for those earlier in their careers.

II. Arts and Literary Arts Residency

The next open application period begins on **March 1, 2016** with a deadline of **May 2, 2016** for residencies in 2017.

The Bellagio Center Arts & Literary Arts residency is for composers, fiction and non-fiction writers, playwrights, poets, video/filmmakers, and visual artists who share in The Rockefeller Foundation's mission of promoting the well-being of humanity around the world and whose work is inspired by or relates to global or social issues. The residency is for artists seeking time for disciplined work, reflection, and collegial engagement with a diverse community of academics, practitioners, and artists.
