

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS: NON EU TEACHING MOBILITY PROGRAM

Kindly be informed that the University of Vienna is inviting applications from faculty members of University of Dar es Salaam for a short-term teaching visit at the University of Vienna.

The visits are open to faculty members in the study fields of the University of Vienna. The deadline for applications for teaching visits between **March and June of 2021** is **September 15, 2020**.

We are confident that teaching visits at the University will be possible by next spring, despite the persistent pandemic. Nonetheless, we assure high flexibility concerning the time period you wish to spend at the University of Vienna and provide the possibility to receive funding for online teaching.

About the program

The teaching assignment comprises an entire university course (30 in-class contact hours). The duration of stay shall be at least 3 weeks and - due to legal restrictions - must not exceed 90 days.

Invited candidates will be provided with a work contract with the University of Vienna. In addition, travel expenses will be reimbursed of up to 2,000 Euro.

Applicants shall prepare the following documents:

- A course syllabus including literature selection for this course
- Letter of support of the home university (incl. information on teaching experience of the applicant)
- Letter of endorsement signed by the Director of Studies at the University of Vienna (Studienprogrammleiter)

- Short CV (may be included in ORCID iD)

- List of publications (may be included in ORCID iD)
